
Marr Djambana because he is proud and loves his culture. Thank you Uncle Wenzel for supporting us!

Do you know what is NAIDOC?

NAIDOC stands for National Aborigines and Islanders Day Observance Committee. Its origins can be traced to the emergence of Aboriginal groups in the 1920's which sought to increase awareness in the wider community of the status and treatment of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Australians.

Each year annual NAIDOC awards recognises the outstanding contributions of Indigenous Australians. These Awards celebrate excellence, builds towards a better future and reminds us of this nation's 65,000-year-old history.
